Quality Reporting Updates Due to COVID-19 Pandemic

In recognition of the strain COVID-19 is putting on healthcare providers, on March 22, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) announced exceptions from reporting requirements for a variety of programs, including hospital quality reporting and performance programs. On March 25, the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FOHRP), which oversees the Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project (MBQIP), sent an announcement to state Flex programs announcing they would also be making exceptions for reporting requirements, making data submission optional over the coming months.

The current MBQIP policy change applies to data due for the upcoming reporting periods:

- Quarter 4, 2019 (Oct 1-Dec 31, 2019)
- Quarter 1, 2020 (Jan 1-Mar 31, 2020)
- Quarter 2, 2020 (Apr 1-Jun 30)


Details on each MBQIP measure and impacted submission periods are available in an updated MBQIP Data Submission Deadlines schedule. FORHP will continue to monitor the developing COVID-19 situation and reassess reporting requirements as needed.

Hospitals that can report MBQIP measures are encouraged to continue reporting, as measures will be used to inform ongoing opportunities to support improvements in care for rural populations. While hospitals direct their resources toward caring for ill patents and ensuring the health and safety of their staff, FORHP recognizes that any quality measure reporting during this national emergency may not be reflective of actual performance. Of note, the updates for MBQIP data submission align with the exceptions for the CMS reporting updates (referenced above).

Administration Request for COVID-19 Data Reporting

On March 29, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) sent a letter to the nation's hospitals on behalf of Vice President Pence requesting they report data in connection with their efforts to fight the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Hospitals are asked to share COVID-19 laboratory data and to report to the National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) COVID-19 Patient Impact and Hospital Capacity Module daily. Details on the request can be found in this CMS press release. If your facility is not yet enrolled in NHSN, follow the 5-Step Enrollment for Acute Care Hospitals/Facilities.
